Thank you for purchasing Movember Photo Slideshow!

It's time for Movember, growing moustaches to raise money for men's health. Use this handy photo slideshow to track your 'tash or promote your company's involvement in the annual mo-growth!

There's a 30 day time-lapse photo sequence plus before and after placeholder areas – everything is editable. The file includes a well groomed VECTOR moustache to fix onto those who didn't quite make it!

Or, perhaps, you could use it to document another time-lapse sequence of company growth – co-worker's pregnancy, company pet or office refurb!

02 // Editing Text

In the Project panel open the folder **01. Edit Comps / Text**

There are editable spots for :

Title Text – the text panel which appears at the beginning of the sequence

Ending Text – the text panel which appears at the end of the sequence

Charity Text – the text panel which appears midway in the sequence

Polaroid Sets – text which appears underneath the Polaroid photo 'pairs' (see Adding Images)

03 // Adding Images

In the Project panel open the folder **01. Edit Comps / Images**

In here are all the editable image compositions for the Polaroids and Sequential images.

Sequence image placeholders contain the 30 photo spots, for your sequential growth, shown at the beginning of the final sequence.

Polaroid image placeholders contain the before & after images (x10) shown at the end of the final sequence. These also contain editable text spots.

04 // Colors

There are no global color change areas on this template.

05 // Rendering

To render simply drop the final composition :

02. Final Comp / Final Comp

into the Render Queue and choose your desired output settings.

Hit render !
